



Tutorial 20 hours for Abitur exam preparation

9:15-10:45	Text analysis This most complex part of the Abitur tasks is where the student has to produce a two part analysis of the text, the first being a demonstration of what the message of the author is and the literary devices he author uses to convey that message; the second requiring the student to compare the text with another text from outside the exam or comment on a theme of the text given in the exam.
10:45-11:00	Break
11:00-12	Essay writing For this first task of the written exam the focus is on demonstrating comprehension and summary of fictional texts and mastering the essay format for doing so. Production of written pieces is followed by teacher marking and feedback..
12:00-13:00	Lunch
13:00-13:45	Listening: (Hörverstehen) The emphasis here is on the types of news and feature items taken from radio broadcasts (e.g. BBC, NPR) that are either very similar to or that have been included on recent Abitur exams. Listening practice is followed by completion of the tasks: identifying the correct description, answering multiple choice questions, and answering comprehension questions. The teaching for this is based on practice, identifying comprehension gaps and learning to listen for gist and detail.
13:45-14:00	Break
14:15-15:00	Mediation Speaking Preparation for this part of the exam is provided in the form of a series of presentation tasks to be presented and assessed by the teacher in class followed by a school wide session to bring all the presentations together before a larger audience followed by Q&A and comment.
15:00-17:00	Self study and exam practice

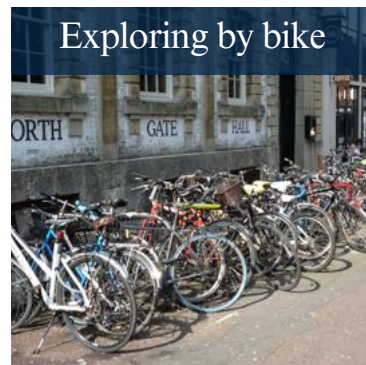

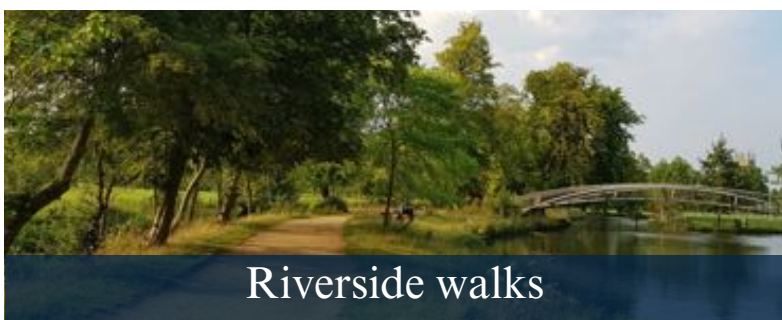

Arrival Transfers

OISE is happy to arrange a personal transfer service for adult and professional students on their arrival into the UK.

A taxi transfer service can be chosen at the time of enrolment and this is booked by the school on behalf of the student. This taxi service takes the student from the point of arrival (airport/station) directly to the accommodation address.

Alternatively, the school can provide information about travelling from the point of arrival by public transport. All airports and stations are served by good public transport links.

To arrange this service, the OISE school will require the student to send details of the arrival flight at least 5 days before arrival.

Transfer on arrival

OISE is happy to help with travel arrangements from the point of arrival. All airports and rail stations are served by an excellent public transport system. Alternatively, OISE can arrange a taxi meeting service.
