Teaching Team

Our academic curriculum is overseen by Assistant Head (Academic), Simon Allen and Simon’s vision for the summer school is woven into every part of the programme. Taking advantage of the expertise and facilities on site, we have created a curriculum that echoes our overall academic philosophy for our pupils.

Our teaching team is led by current Charterhouse staff and expert teachers from outside the school. In addition, students will be introduced to inspirational leaders in their field through specialist workshops and seminars during the course.

Academics



English Language

Suited to students of all abilities using English as a second language, we use a diverse range of classroom techniques to engage students and build confidence in spoken English. A summer school in England is the perfect setting to learn the language while being immersed in spoken English and culture 24-hours a day.

Our interactive classroom lessons are divided into levels and inspire and engage students using popular topics that they are motivated to discuss and debate. The syllabus is intricately and professionally designed in order to be a classroom instrument which facilitates the learning process, while our experienced and highly qualified teachers create a dynamic and vibrant classroom experience which is distinctly different from term-time education.

A pre-course assessment helps us to understand students' English levels before they arrive at the school, and they will also speak with a teacher on the first day so as to be correctly placed in a class tailored to their ability. Lessons are designed to build confidence in spoken English through enthusiastic interaction. This culminates in students producing and delivering a presentation on a chosen topic to classmates at the end of the course, celebrating their new-found skills and confidence in spoken English.

Classroom language practice is underpinned by a 24/7 English experience throughout the camp, with all other electives and activities being delivered in English, ensuring that conversational language skills acquired in lessons give students the tools to effectively communicate in real life settings.

- ▶ **Develop your presentation and debating skills in class**

- ▶ **Improve all core English skills – with a focus on pronunciation, listening and speaking skills**
- ▶ **Develop understanding of a range of topics and situations**



Focusing on the specific English language skills required to study at English universities or on other English-speaking academic programmes, this course is for those who already have a high level of written and spoken English.

Students will be introduced to IELTS Academic, the English exam often required to apply to an English-Speaking university course and accepted by over 11,000 organisations worldwide. With a focus on the IELTS exam tasks, our course gives students the tools they need to successfully and confidently study an academic course delivered and assessed in the English language.

We concentrate on language techniques that can prove challenging when using English in academia, particularly at university level. Covering a breadth of skills from critical analysis and argument formation to essay writing, presenting and debating, this course is designed to push students to the next level of academic fluency.

Students will learn how to analyse articles, studies and research papers, while developing their critical writing skills, and ability to construct arguments with the correct formality and academic register for maximum clarity and impact at university level. By exploring IELTS speaking exam questions, spoken English practice will include the development of debate, public speaking, and presentation skills; improving confidence and ability to communicate ideas clearly and with ease.

With this insight into English for academic purposes, students will develop a sophisticated tool with which to convey their intellectual aptitude, giving them confidence in applying to or succeeding in English-speaking academic settings.

- ▶ **Knowledge of the academic register required for university essay writing and improved understanding of research techniques, structure and development**
- ▶ **Improved confidence in both written and spoken English**
- ▶ **Increased confidence in debating, presenting and public speaking**

Entrepreneurship

Be inspired to think differently. Learn the underlying principles of developing a business and find out how successful entrepreneurs operate. Put creative thinking into practice by developing a business idea or product to pitch to the class.

Innovation and creative thinking are some of the most important skills required to succeed in many business settings and are skills we value highly at Charterhouse. Often, the opportunity to develop these practical, creative skills becomes limited in school, in favour of the academic learning required for exams.

The entrepreneurship programme is a great opportunity for growth, not just for those interested in business but for anyone looking to challenge themselves to create and innovate. Through this course, students develop an entrepreneurial mindset, ready to challenge the status quo and proactively innovate for change.

We will look at case studies on inspirational entrepreneurs through history and examine how they excelled and their impact on society.

Students will research and present on inspirational entrepreneurs that inspire them, look at case studies of successful businesses and study the positive impact that these businesses have on individuals and society. Students will understand the framework for setting up and launching a product and will then have a chance to launch their own idea to our teaching team at the end of the course.

Students develop skills in creative thinking, problem-solving, leadership, organising and presenting information and will gain an understanding of how business works as well as environmental and societal considerations.

- ▶ Understanding the tools required to plan and start a business
- ▶ Improved creative thinking and problem solving skills
- ▶ Insight into the world of business through the history of entrepreneurship
- ▶ Better understanding of the qualities required for successful leadership
- ▶ Experience and understanding of project management, strategy and teamwork
- ▶ Appreciation of the breadth of global business opportunities
- ▶ Ability to make a future job application or university application stand out



Global Leadership with PPE

Join our Global leadership course to develop your knowledge of the political, economic, and philosophical challenges facing our world today. This programme provides students with the opportunity to expand and develop knowledge of leadership and the impact leaders have in the modern world. This course is suitable for anyone interested in a career in economics, politics, or leadership in general or would like to learn more about international relations.

In this class students will:

- ▶ Study the effect of economics on government policy
- ▶ Study business and government case studies, with project work on inspirational global leaders
- ▶ Discuss business morality and corporate responsibility
- ▶ Examine the concepts and values used in analysis of both political and economic systems
- ▶ Discuss current leadership challenges such as climate change

Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Understanding the principles around which society has been constructed and the challenges to those principles in the modern age
- ▶ Learn how to think strategically and develop leadership skills in relation to issues that matter to you
- ▶ Critical thinking, analytical and problem-solving skills
- ▶ Improved communication, debating and negotiation skills
- ▶ Gain in confidence dealing with complex ideas and topics
- ▶ Improved debating and presentation skills



Engineering, Technology and Design

These three subjects are collectively shaping the modern world. This multidisciplinary course gives pupils a three-dimensional understanding of the essential skills required to develop technologies that enhance our lives.

Students learn how scientific principles underpin the design and development of machines and technological structures of all kinds. They learn some of the underlying laws of nature and their real-world design application such as selecting appropriate materials based on their properties and designing according to these.

Taking aspects of mathematics, the sciences, computer science and even basic economics, students gain a broad understanding of how different disciplines work together to innovate for the future. The course also covers technical drawing and computer aided design (CAD), teaching students how to accurately present design work.

With a view to how automation can streamline the production process, students will get the opportunity to program a robot to fulfil a specific function.

The course will cover

- ▶ Basic mechanics
- ▶ Design methodology
- ▶ Design and realisation of a structure (e.g. model bridge/building)
- ▶ Group presentation on design and costing
- ▶ Programming basics
- ▶ Use of a programmable robot

Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Enhanced practical and experimental skills
- ▶ Improved mathematical skills including an understanding of data analysis
- ▶ An understanding of the principles of design
- ▶ Enhanced communication and team-work skills



Python, Data Science and Machine Learning

Get inside the dynamic world of technology and data. This course is designed to give you the tools and knowledge to start your journey towards conquering the ever-evolving digital landscape. Split into three parts: Python, Data Science and Machine Learning (AI) students learn about some of the most important frontiers in these fields, and where they may see themselves in a future tech career.

Mastering Python. The most influential and widely used programming language in the world, Python is used for everything from AI to gaming to cyber security. Beginners will learn the basics, taking their first steps towards coding greatness while any more experienced programmers on the course will delve deeper into more advanced Python concepts.

The Power of Data Science. There's no shortage of data available to us in the modern world. But how do we unlock the power of data to predict outcomes and inform the future? Students will learn how to make meaningful predictions from data in a wide range of contexts while discovering the almost limitless, powerful, useful and sometimes dangerous potential that data science presents.

Machine Learning and The Future. At the cutting edge of computer science and modern technology is machine learning. Diving into the world of Artificial Intelligence, students take on challenges that spark the imagination. From neural networks attempting to mimic the human brain to Reinforcement learning systems that can master complex tasks like playing video games. Students get hands-on experience with these disruptive technologies while discussing how they're transforming the world around us and what they could mean for the future.

Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Project-based real-time use case for each concept
- ▶ Hands-on programming experiments
- ▶ Software development skills
- ▶ Teamwork, logic and problem-solving skills
- ▶ Real-world future business demands for these technologies



Choosing one elective to focus on throughout the course, students enjoy creative enrichment through arts, sports or technology alongside their academic study. Electives run for 2 hours a day, 5 days a week and make up 20 hours of the overall programme.

Electives



Tennis

Suitable for improving players who play tennis regularly, the tennis elective is run by Lawn Tennis Association qualified coaches. Playing on our own tennis courts at the school, coaches focus on speed, strategy, coordination and overall technique in fun and dynamic sessions that bring out the best in players.

With a focus on personal improvement through teamwork and fun, the tennis elective offers students a chance to improve in a supportive environment with friendly competition.

Specific tennis lessons include sessions on speed and strength, balance, approach shots to the net, returning serves, serving, net play, footwork, volleying and more.

Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Improve on specific tennis skills and techniques
- ▶ Develop and understand mental focus
- ▶ Improve fitness, flexibility, coordination and balance
- ▶ Learn about match strategy
- ▶ Develop teamwork and leadership skills
- ▶ Gain confidence on and off the court



Art

Our team of professional artists guide students through a creative journey. Introducing a variety of artistic techniques in fun and interactive workshops, students then choose an area of focus for their main project. Creativity and self-expression are encouraged and supported by the teaching team, with each student getting the chance to show their work at the end of the course.

Students will develop their skills and understanding of different media, materials and techniques during workshops and build the confidence to conceptualise and complete their own project.

Students will be inspired by the majestic surroundings at Charterhouse School while also drawing inspiration from visits to famous art galleries and exhibitions during the course.

The art department at Charterhouse is a lively, popular and creative hub of activity with excellent facilities and equipment, ensuring pupils have all the tools they need to realise their creative vision.

Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Develop and build artistic skills and techniques
- ▶ Experience of visiting galleries and exhibitions and taking inspiration from other artists' work
- ▶ Understand how to plan and develop a creative concept from imagination to reality
- ▶ Learn about new artistic techniques, media and materials





Robotics and Game Design

The course uses gamification to bring to life these pioneering areas of technical advancements with fun-filled exercises. You will learn to write code in a variety of programming languages while playing computer games and building robots.

Game Design using Roblox and Lua

Students design and build their own obstacle game in Roblox Studio and publish it for others to play. They configure and create their own custom models using Lua programming, a powerful text-based scripting language.

Python Game Development

Unlock your passion for Python programming, a very popular coding language in current businesses. You explore the fundamentals of programming concepts using a block-based interface called EduBlock.

LEGO Robotics Programming

Students build complex robots in this engaging, hands-on session using their own LEGO WeDO 2.0 kit. They use sensors and motors to program their models using loops, logic operations, and mathematical operations in a block-based coding interface.

IoT Device Robotics

Using pocket-sized computers and device-based programming, students build hands-on prototypes using LEDs, breadboards, and sensors to create real-time electronic devices. They will discover their passion for technical knowledge in Electronics and IoT computing.



Drama

Suitable for anyone interested in theatre, students can get involved in all aspects of the creative process. Working as a group, students are guided by our teacher to create, design, produce and star in their own production.

Drama is thriving at Charterhouse and we want to extend this passion to our summer school students. We have a state-of-the-art theatre and excellent technical support to assist students in bringing their production to life on-stage.

This course will cover:

- ▶ Exercises that explore the techniques of acting
- ▶ Voice projection skills
- ▶ Improvisation
- ▶ The importance of movement in storytelling
- ▶ The creative process in writing and producing a piece of work
- ▶ The importance of reflecting both during and after the creative process

Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Enhanced self-confidence
- ▶ Understanding of the skills required to create and perform a production
- ▶ Ability to apply workshop skills to production and live performance
- ▶ Appreciation of the variety of forms, practices and traditions within theatre
- ▶ Improved individual communication skills
- ▶ Teamwork and leadership skills





Sports and Leadership

What makes a good leader? How do you communicate your ideas to a team? Our sports and leadership elective teaches transferable leadership skills through an array of exciting sports and activities from the traditional to the adventurous:

- ▶ Football

- ▶ Swimming
- ▶ Rounders
- ▶ Raft Building
- ▶ Sailing
- ▶ Climbing
- ▶ Orienteering

Working in a fun, energetic and challenging environment, students develop their self-confidence through teamwork, goalsetting and effective communication. Competitive elements are on a team-level and everyone is guided, supported and encouraged by our sports staff.

This elective accelerates mastering some of life's most valuable skills both in and outside the workplace – confidence, communication, teamwork, problem-solving and resilience.

Charterhouse has a rich sporting history. Not only were we an integral part of the creation of the modern game of football in the 1800s but many full-time pupils have gone on to have successful careers in professional sports.

We have excellent sports facilities including a climbing wall, indoor pool and numerous sports fields and courts. We also take advantage of the beautiful surrounding countryside, a dedicated conservation area.

Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Increased confidence, resilience and self-motivation
- ▶ Enhanced teamwork and communication skills
- ▶ Ability to apply new sporting techniques
- ▶ Planning and organisational skills
- ▶ Ability to set, meet and evaluate goals
- ▶ A basic understanding of the value and function of sports psychology



Photography

Working with a professional photographer, students first learn about a variety of fundamental photography techniques and fields before choosing to focus on a specific project for a mini portfolio to showcase at the end of the course.

Students journey through a brief history of photography in an introductory session, understanding the transition from film to digital media. We look at how software and hardware such as photoshop, lightroom and smart phone cameras have changed the face of photography in the modern world.

Understanding how to identify, create and adjust to properly frame images is the first step to creating the perfect scene. Students explore a range of composition techniques such as the law of thirds, symmetry and dynamic tension, using the beautiful surroundings of the school to showcase their understanding in practice.

We then adjust our cameras to manual mode and journey through various settings and their effect on the relationship between the light and the lens, mastering these complex settings to achieve the perfect shot.

Then it's time to get creative, supporting students to create a mini portfolio to a professional standard, using the IT suite to edit and perfect their images before showcasing their portfolio at the end of the course. Everyone will be able to take their work home with them.

Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Gain an insight into the history of photography
- ▶ Understand how to use a DSLR camera
- ▶ Develop understanding of composition techniques
- ▶ Ability to shoot in manual mode
- ▶ Enhanced creative and project work skills
- ▶ Understanding of how to process films

Activities & Trips

Hampton Court Palace – Half Day


Discover the home of Henry VIII!

If You need to contact us, please refer to clause 12.2 of these Terms and Condition on how to do so.

Key words

In these Terms and Conditions:

'We', 'Us', 'Our' or 'CMT Learning' is a reference to CMT Learning Limited.

'Authorised Adult' means the parent or legal guardian of a Participant.

'Booking' means the booking You have placed for a Camp with Us through charterhousesummerschool.com, by phone or by email.

'Camp' is any residential or day programme offered by Charterhouse Summer School or CMT Learning.

'CMT Reseller' means a specialist education agency or company duly authorised by CMT Learning to market and sell Camps

'Deposit' means any such deposit as We may specify or require per Participant for any Camp.

'Participant' means the person for whom a place on a Camp is booked.

'Player Welfare Form' means the form completed by You disclosing various information relating to the Participant and providing all relevant consents.

'Website' means charterhousesummerschool.com.

'Voucher' means a credit note for the full amount You have paid to Us which is redeemable against any Camp in the same or following year for the Participant or any family member or friend.

'You' 'Your' means the person booking or arranging for the booking and includes parents and guardians ("Authorised Adult") or CMT Reseller as the case may be

'Airport Transfer' means transfers of a Participant between selected UK airports and camp venues.

1. Making a booking and pricing

1.1 After You book a place on a Camp, We will send You an "Order Confirmation Email" confirming that We have processed Your application and deposit payment. All applications are subject to acceptance by Us in line with these Terms and Conditions. Your offer is accepted by Us and a binding agreement is created between Us and You if You have not heard otherwise within 7 days of receiving Your "Order Confirmation Email".

1.2 It is important that You check the details in Your "Order Confirmation Email" when You receive it. If You have any questions or any of the information is inaccurate please contact Us immediately.

1.3 The Website sets out further details of the specific requirements for each Camp, which You agree that You have read and understood as part of the Booking process.

1.4 Each booking on a Camp must be accompanied by payment of the appropriate Camp fee of either: (a) full payment; or (b) Deposit payment followed by the balance payment not later than 1st May before the camp starts.

1.5 Participant will not be allowed to attend a Camp unless all charges for that Camp have been paid before the Camp starts and We reserve

the right to cancel any bookings held on Your behalf after any payment is overdue.

1.6 Payment of the Deposit is due when You book a place on a Camp. We shall only send You an "Order Confirmation Email" once We have received Your completed application and Deposit payment (or full payment).

1.7 The price of airport transfers is detailed on Our Website and is payable at the time of booking. Airport Transfer bookings are only confirmed when payment is received following which they are non-refundable.

1.8 By booking a place on a Camp You confirm that:

1.8.1 You are legally capable of entering into binding contracts;

1.8.2 You are at least 18 years old;

1.8.3 You are booking a Camp either as an Authorised Adult or as a CMT Reseller for an individual Participant.

1.8.4 You are not booking places on Camps which You intend to resell unless You are a CMT Reseller.

1.8.5 You have read and accepted the Terms and Conditions defined here;

1.8.6 the price of Camps and any additional fees We may charge will be as stated on the Website from time to time, unless there is an obvious error. These prices and additional fees may change at any time.

1.8.7 You are responsible for arranging and paying for the Participant's travel to and from the Camp venue.

1.8.8 You understand that prices include any applicable Value Added Tax ("VAT"). If the rate of VAT changes before You make any payment due to Us We may adjust the price You pay.

1.9 If You are a CMT Reseller then You agree to disclose these Terms and Conditions to the Participant's Authorised Adult and that he or she agrees and accepts that these Terms and Conditions are binding on them as if he or she had applied on behalf of the Participant to book a place on a Camp.

2. Cancellation and refunds

2.1 How to cancel a Booking

To cancel a Booking, You must inform Us by email to info@charterhousesummerschool.com Proof of email dispatch is not proof of receipt. If You do not receive a response within 3 days, You should contact Us by telephone.

2.2 Our refunds policy

Residential Camp Bookings:

2.2.1 If You cancel Your Booking within 14 days of making a Booking then, provided the Camp has not already started, We will provide You with a full refund (inclusive of Your Deposit).

2.2.2 If You cancel Your Booking more than 14 days after We have accepted Your Booking, then:-

(a) If You cancel more than 30 days before the first day of Your Camp and have paid for the Camp in full, We will refund the amount You have paid for the Camp, less Your Deposit; or

(b) If You cancel more than 30 days before the first day of Your Camp and have not paid for the Camp in full (e.g. if You have only paid the Deposit), You will not be required to pay the balance for the Camp, however You will not be entitled to a refund of Your Deposit; or

(c) If You cancel less than 30 days before the first day of Your Camp You will not be eligible for any refund, including the Deposit; and

(d) If We do not receive Your balance payment on time We may cancel Your booking and You will not be due any refund. We will notify You of this by email.

2.2.3 If You cancel Your Booking 14 days or less from the Camp start date You will not be eligible for any refund.

2.3 Cancellation on medical grounds

2.3.1 If the Participant is unable to attend because he or she is ill or injured, We will offer You a Voucher for all fees paid, provided that You notify Us of the illness or injury at least 24 hours before the Camp starts. We will require a letter from the Participant's doctor as proof of the illness or injury before issuing the Voucher. This Voucher will be valid for any comparable Booking made on any of Our Camps in the same or following year (subject to availability). The Voucher is transferrable to any family member and may be used on any Camp that We offer. Please note that the Voucher has no monetary value and cannot be exchanged for cash.

2.3.2 Participants who leave early during their Camp due to illness or injury will receive a pro-rated Voucher with a value that is pro-rated to the unused proportion of the Camp. This can be used as a credit against any Booking on any of Our Camps in the same or following year. The voucher is transferrable to any family member and may be used on any Camp that We offer.

2.4 Airport Transfers

2.4.1 Our Airport Transfer service must be pre-booked at least four weeks before the start of the Camp and is only available at the selected airports, dates and times specified on Our Website. Once booked and paid, this is non-refundable.

2.4.2 You are responsible for arranging and paying for the Participant's flights including any airline fees for an Unaccompanied Minor service should You book one. You must notify Us of the Participant's flight details, including details of any Unaccompanied Minor service booked with the airline, at least four weeks before the start of the Camp, by email. Proof of email dispatch is not proof of receipt. If You do not receive a response from Us within 3 days, You should contact Us by telephone.

2.4.3 You are responsible for complying with all airline requirements. We have no obligation to provide a refund or any other assistance where a Participant is unable to board a flight, cannot be released by the UK Border Agency or attend a Camp because of Your failure to comply with any such requirement. You are responsible for and will refund to Us any additional reasonable costs We incur as a result of Your failure to comply with any such requirement (for example, if a Participant loses any travel documentation or if an airline refuses to allow an unaccompanied minor to board a flight).

2.4.4 If You change flight details after an Airport Transfer has been booked and confirmed by Us, You must email Us the changed details immediately **and** You must also phone Our office to confirm these instructions.

2.4.5 You are responsible for, and will refund to Us, any additional reasonable costs We incur as a result of You providing Us with inaccurate or incomplete flight information (for example, if We incur additional airport transfer charges because a Participant arrives on a different flight from the notified flight, or if You fail to disclose to Us that a Participant is travelling as an Unaccompanied Minor).

2.4.6 If You book a flight for a date or time outside of Our selected dates and times as listed on the Website, then please note that, if we are able to arrange this, there will be a minimum surcharge of £250 payable in addition to the Airport Transfer fee.

2.5 Other terms relating to cancellation

2.5.1 If a Participant is refused a visa to enter the UK to attend a Camp We will offer a full refund subject to You being able to provide satisfactory proof of visa refusal at least 45 days before the Camp start date. We will require a copy of the original documentation issued by the Entry Clearance Officer stating that the visa application has been declined. If a Participant is refused a visa to enter the UK less than 45 days before the camp start date, then We may offer You a Voucher for all fees paid, and You will not be offered a refund. If the refusal of the visa is for reasons relating to travel restrictions imposed as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic clause 2.5.3 below will apply and a Voucher will be issued instead of a refund.

Cancellation by Us (Force Majeure)

2.5.2 Due to circumstances beyond Our control including insufficient participation, natural disasters such as floods, warfare, security concerns or disease outbreak, We may cancel, move or postpone a Camp. If We postpone or cancel a Camp for any reason We will provide You with a Voucher for a place for the Participant at a comparable Camp at one of Our locations in the same or the following year (but You will not be entitled to a cash refund). If we move a Camp from the advertised location to another location and providing that in Our reasonable opinion the Camp in the new location will be of comparable quality to the Camp in the advertised location, then if You wish to cancel Your Booking Clause 2.2 of Our Refunds Policy will apply.

Cancellation by Us (Covid-19)

2.5.3 We shall be entitled to cancel a Camp at any time up to the start of the Camp if, in Our reasonable opinion the operation of the Camp is impossible, illegal or materially difficult or if the operation of the Camp is likely to be uneconomic due to circumstances arising from the Covid-19 pandemic. We may exercise the right to cancel if circumstances arise or are reasonably likely to arise such as a further wave of cases, a further or continuing periods of lockdown or new or continuing Governmental restrictions which, in Our reasonable opinion are likely to a) prevent or restrict travel to the Camp by a significant number of participants; or b) make the operation of the Camp impossible, illegal or materially difficult; or c) render the operation of the Camp uneconomic. If We postpone or cancel a Camp for reasons defined in this clause 2.5.3 then We will provide You with a full refund of all fees paid provided You made the booking after 1st October 2021 and Your booking was not made with a Voucher from a previous year.

2.5.4 If We move a Camp from the advertised location to another location and providing that in Our reasonable opinion the Camp in the new location will be of comparable quality to the Camp in the advertised location, then if You wish to cancel Your Booking Clause 2.2 of Our Refunds Policy will apply.

2.5.5 In all cases where You are eligible to receive a refund or a Voucher, We will process the refund or issue the Voucher within 60 days of notice of cancellation. Refunds will be provided using the same method You used to pay.

2.5.6 Please note that if we have issued a Voucher to you and you have re-booked with the Voucher and the Camp for which you have re-booked is cancelled for reasons outside of our control under clause

2.5.2 or 2.5.3 then the Voucher will be carried forward to a new Camp in the same or the following year.

3. Fitness and risk of injury

3.1 It is Your responsibility to tell Us if the Participant suffers from any physical or mental conditions which may give rise to any special needs or affect their ability to participate in the Camp. Providing this information will enable Us to make any reasonable adjustments that may be required to reflect the Participant's physical or mental needs during the Camp.

3.2 We may require additional information depending on the medical information supplied to Us prior to the Camp.

3.3 If a Participant arrives at a Camp with a medical condition which has not been disclosed or fully disclosed to Us, or such condition presents itself during the course of the Camp or the Participant's medical history has not been sufficiently disclosed to Us to the extent that We are able to make an informed judgement on the fitness of the Participant to take part in the Camp, then We may decline to accept the Participant on the Camp or require the Participant to leave the Camp, as the case may be.

4. Medical Condition and Care

4.1 Before accepting a Booking for a Participant we will require that our Player Welfare Form is completed. You agree to complete the Player Welfare Form completely and accurately and agree to inform Us of any relevant medical condition affecting the Participant and any treatment or medication which the Participant may require.

4.2 We will not be obliged to accept a Booking where we reasonably believe that we do not have the expertise, experience or facilities to properly care for the Participant.

4.3 In the event that following completion of the Player Welfare Form we have requested that You to provide Us with additional information concerning the Participant and any relevant medical condition, treatment or medication, then the Booking will not be confirmed and the Participant shall be not be allowed to attend the Camp until You have received clearance confirmation in writing from us. We will be entitled to require that conditions are met before granting clearance which may include an agreement to cover the cost of additional staffing or providing further information and evidence.

4.4 If You fail to disclose any relevant medical conditions (including, without limitation, any allergies) affecting the Participant, or any treatment or medication which the Participant requires and which We become aware of on or after arrival of the Participant at the airport or the Camp then, you do so accepting full risk and responsibility associated with doing so, AND We, at our sole discretion, may do any of the following:

4.4.1 refuse entry to the Participant to our Camp;

4.4.2 allow temporary access to the Camp and:

4.4.2.1 seek attention from the relevant medical professional / expert in respect of the medical condition and / or medication should We not have access to the relevant expertise;

4.4.2.2 subject to clause 4.2, provide any treatment and / or medication as directed by any medical professional / expert;

4.4.2.3 upon receipt of medical advice, irrespective of what the advice may be, refuse entry to the Participant; and / or

4.4.3 carry out any action We deem necessary.

4.5 In the event that Participant is refused entry pursuant with this clause 4, then within 24 hours of refusal, arrangements will be made by Us to send the Participant back home, this will include all travel arrangements and the Authorised Adult will be informed of this and will ensure that they are available to assist the Participant home.

4.6 You shall be liable for all and any direct, indirect or associated costs that We incur in accordance with clause 4.1 to 4.5, including but not limited to, travel costs for the Participant and any other person (such as a flight ticket, a train ticket, taxi etc.), medical professional/ expert costs, additional staffing costs etc.

4.7 In the event that the Participant needs medical attention during any Camp then You agree to Us arranging for any appropriate and necessary emergency treatment. We will endeavour to contact the Emergency Contact named on the Booking Form or Player Welfare Form to obtain their consent to any decision regarding the arrangement of such treatment. However, You agree that in emergency situations We may not be able to contact that person, and may proceed to arrange and consent to such treatment without doing so. In arranging or sanctioning any treatment We will take the advice of suitably qualified doctors, clinicians and medically trained staff and You agree that We and they are entitled to assume that the medical information You have supplied is complete, accurate and up to date.

4.8 Please note that if a Participant is injured or becomes unwell We may, in some cases, reasonably determine that no medical treatment is required, or that only general first aid is required. In each case You acknowledge that We are entitled to exercise Our reasonable discretion regarding the need for further medical treatment. Provided that We have acted reasonably in all the circumstances (having due regard to

the symptoms presented by the Participant while in Our care) You agree that You will not hold Us liable for any decision not to administer or authorize further medical treatment for the Participant. For more information on Our liability, please see clause 6 below.

5. Insurance

5.1 It is Your responsibility to ensure that the Participant has adequate travel and medical insurance to cover the costs of any medical treatment that may be required. Your insurance should also cover any additional costs associated with accommodation, travel, transport and/or repatriation to the Participant's home country. You should be aware that following the UK's exit from the EU, European citizens can no longer be guaranteed free healthcare at the point of delivery in the UK. Your insurance policy needs to take account of that. The Participant must bring the relevant medical insurance policy documents with them to the Camp and provide these to Camp staff at registration.

6. Liability

6.1 We are responsible to You for foreseeable loss and damage caused by Us. If We fail to comply with these Terms and Conditions, We are only responsible for loss or damage You suffer that is a foreseeable result of Our breaking this contract or Our failure to use reasonable care and skill. Loss or damage is foreseeable if either it is obvious that it will happen or if, at the time the contract was made, both We and You knew it might happen, for example, if You discussed it with Us or with a CMT Reseller during the sales process.

6.2 We are not liable for:

6.2.1 any losses or costs incurred by You as a result of Us exercising any rights contained within clause 4.1 to 4.6;

6.2.2 any losses caused by any other breach of Our agreement by any person other than us; and

6.2.3 any business losses.

6.3 Nothing in this clause excludes or limits in any way Our liability to You where it would be unlawful to do so. This includes: liability for death or personal injury caused by Our negligence or the negligence of Our employees, agents or subcontractors; fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation; or breach of Your legal rights in relation to the Camp.

6.4 Please note that any travel or participation carries a risk of illness or infection. As such there is a risk that the Participant will contract Covid-19 (Coronavirus) or another disease as a result of a pandemic, epidemic or ongoing transmission of easily transmissible diseases. It is agreed that provided that We have taken adequate precautions in line with the current advice from UK Government and have not otherwise been negligent we will not be liable in the event of infection.

6.5 Where an Authorised Adult collects the Participant from the camp, that Authorised Adult is responsible for ensuring that the Participant has in their possession any valuables, flight tickets, passport, money or other items that might have been kept by Us during the duration of the Camp.

6.6 We do not accept any responsibility for belongings left with Us including passports, tickets, cash and valuables

6.7 We do not accept responsibility for any items belonging to the Participant which he or she has left at the Camp.

6.8 While We will endeavour to remind all Participants to pack all their belongings and collect their valuables from the Camp administrator, We take no responsibility for a Participant losing or forgetting their passport, flight tickets or any other items. Any additional costs incurred by Us on behalf of the Participant including replacement passport, air tickets or other documentation will be charged to You.

6.9 Where We have reasonable grounds and/or clinical evidence to indicate that the Participant may be suffering from an Infectious Disease We may require an Authorised Adult to remove the Participant from the Camp within 24 hours of the time We notify You.

6.10 Where We have grounds to believe that the Participant has engaged in any form of harassment or abuse against any person including Our staff, other participants or any other third party attending the Camp, We will require an Authorised Adult to remove the Participant from the Camp within 24 hours of the time You have been notified of their removal from the Camp. You will be responsible for the return of the Participant and, where necessary, You shall reimburse Us for all associated costs, whether direct or indirect, incurred by Us in arranging to return the Participant.

7. Visa support letters

7.1 If You ask Us to do so, We may provide a visa support letter to assist the Participant in obtaining a visa to enter the United Kingdom to attend the Camp. Please note, however, that You will remain solely responsible for ensuring that the Participant is granted a visa to enter the United Kingdom. For the avoidance of doubt, We make no guarantee that Our visa support letter will result in the Participant being granted a visa, and accept no liability if the Participant's visa application is declined or You otherwise fail to obtain a visa.

7.2 For the avoidance of doubt, We are not liable for any further costs other than pursuant to Our cancellations and refunds policy as set out in clause 2 of these Terms and Conditions.

8. Removal of Participants from Camps

8.1 Participants on Camps must adhere to all of the rules and regulations of the Camp as specified by Us from time to time including the Camp Ethos rules ("Camp Policies") which can be viewed [HERE](#) and will be supplied to all Participants at the start of the Camp. The Camp Policies apply at any location where Camps are held, and include all oral or written instructions given by the Camp staff at any location where Camps are held. By making a Booking You accept and agree that the Camp Policies form part of the agreement between Us.

8.2 We treat as a priority the safety and well-being of all Participants attending Our Camps. We therefore reserve the right to remove from Our Camps, without refund, any Participant who does not comply with the Camp Policies. We also reserve the right to remove from Our Camps, without refund, any Participant who We consider to be generally disruptive or is behaving in a way that may be a danger to or upsetting for others.

8.3 We reserve the right to ask any Participant to leave the camp who is, in Our opinion, not physically or mentally capable of participating safely in the Camp.

8.4 If a Participant is removed from a Camp it is Your responsibility to organise and pay for any travel, accommodation or other expenses incurred.

9. Complaints

9.1 It is Our aim to provide the best Camp experience possible. However, if You are not satisfied with something please inform Our Camp staff using the contact numbers provided or call Our office and We will do everything possible to resolve the issue.

9.2 When the Participant returns home, if You feel that You need to make a formal complaint, please send a letter or email Us within 28 days of the end date of the Camp using the contact details set out in clause 12.2.

9.3 The British Accreditation Council (BAC), an organisation that accredits our camps, has its own formal student complaints procedure in place. Details about the BAC's complaints procedure can be found on their website: www.the-bac.org.

10. Intellectual Property

10.1 The Website together with the form and content of Our marketing materials and including any training documents, scripts and other materials and any intellectual property rights comprised in any of Our services which belong to Us or Our licensors ("Materials") is protected by copyright and other intellectual property rights and all such rights are reserved.

10.2 "CMT" and "Charterhouse Summer Schools" are trading names of CMT Learning Limited, "Charterhouse" and any Charterhouse logos are trademarks of Charterhouse School. All rights in relation to any trading names or trademarks are expressly reserved and may not be used or reproduced without Our express consent.

10.3 The Materials may not be reproduced, duplicated, copied, sold, resold, visited, or otherwise exploited for any commercial purpose without Our express written consent. You may not systematically extract and/or re-utilise parts of the contents of the Materials by any means whatsoever, including by using automated computer programs (including spider or other web crawler programs), without Our express written consent.

10.4 All intellectual property and other rights comprised in the form and content of Our Camps belongs to CMT Learning Limited, and no materials or content in relation to any Camp may be reproduced, duplicated, copied, sold, resold, visited, or otherwise exploited for any commercial purpose.

11. Data Protection

11.1 We agree to comply with Our obligations under all applicable laws and regulations relating to data protection and privacy as may be applicable from time to time, which at the date of these Terms and Conditions means the Data Protection Act 2018 and the GDPR (EU General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679) and any successor legislation ("Data Protection Legislation").

11.2 For further details on how We comply with the Data Protection Legislation please refer to Our Privacy Policy which can be seen [HERE](#).

12. General

12.1 Certain laws require that some information We give You should be in writing. You accept that most communication with Us will be electronic (occasionally We may write to You by letter). We will contact You by email or provide You with information by posting notices on the Website.
