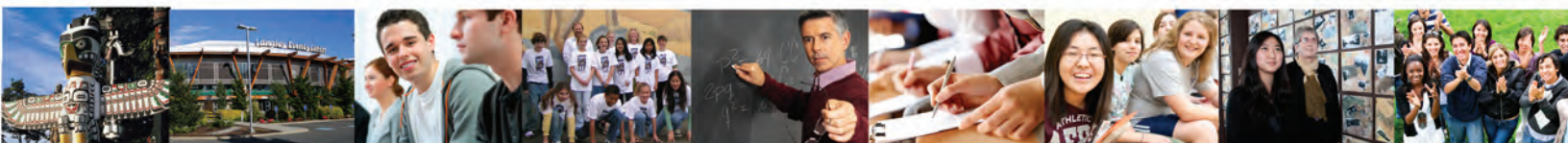




Student Care and Support

In order to succeed academically, students must be happy and well supported. Teachers and dedicated International Student Program (ISP) Coordinators in each secondary school work closely with students to make sure their academic, social and emotional needs are addressed. Regular communication between teachers, students, coordinators and home-stay families allows us to address concerns quickly. Report cards are sent to students' families in their home countries to ensure parents know how their children are progressing in school and in their daily life. Parents are welcome to contact ISP Coordinators directly for progress updates.



Homestay

We have been operating our own homestay department since the beginning of the International Student Program in 1989. Over the years we have gained considerable experience and expertise. Parents of international students can be assured that we work 24 hours a day to ensure student safety and comfort. Our Homestay Team carefully screens and selects homes where students are welcomed and included as one of the family. In the Homestay Family, students can comfortably and confidently improve their English and experience Canadian culture.

All our Homestay homes include:

- A private room with a bed, desk and lamp, and a dresser.
- 3 substantial meals a day and snacks.
- Students often live within walking distance of their schools, or host families provide transportation to and from school.

Processing Requests, Aligning Experiences

To apply to the Langley International Student Program we request that you apply online at www.StudyInLangley.com or follow the simple steps below. You can download a copy of our Application Form from our website StudyInLangley.com, or you can contact our office by email at ISPadmissions@SD35.bc.ca and request that we send you a copy.

Application Procedure

-Fill out On-Line Application Form in English. Make sure the legal agreement is completed by both student and parent.

-Attach your report cards for the previous 2 years of studies.

-Photocopy and attach the picture page of the student's passport (if available)

-We will acknowledge receipt of your application. A "Statement of Account" (SoA) letter will be sent to you by e-mail. Any other applicable forms will be sent to you at this time as well.

-In order to issue the letter of acceptance and hold your spot at school, please pay the TOTAL FEES indicated on the SoA letter immediately.

-Payment and bank information are indicated on the SoA letter.

-Please fax or e-mail a copy of the wire transfer confirmation to our office after the payment has been made.

When we receive payment in full we will issue an official "Letter of Acceptance" (LoA) that is required for Study Permit (Visa) application. This letter will be emailed to you. It will contain information students need to know before and after arrival.

-A student information package will be sent to you with the LoA. It will contain information students need to know before and after arrival.

Bereits seit dem Jahre 1989 begrüßt der Schulbezirk Langley Schüler/innen aus dem Ausland. Unser Studienprogramm für Auslandsschüler/innen (*International Student Program - ISP*) wartet mit einem breitgefächerten Bildungsangebot auf, wie beispielsweise der Möglichkeit, den Grund- und Sekundarschulabschluss zu erwerben oder im Sommer hier Sprach- und Kulturferien zu verbringen. Unsere Schulen zeichnen sich durch ein hervorragendes Lernklima aus und bieten den Schülern zahlreiche Kursoptionen; Sekundarschüler, ganz gleich ob sie Anfänger oder Fortgeschrittene sind, erhalten ausgezeichneten Förderunterricht im Fach Englisch. Außerdem ist jeder Sekundarschule ein spezieller Koordinator für die Auslandsschüler zugeordnet.

Der Schulbezirk Langley liegt nur etwa 45 Kilometer von Vancouver entfernt in British Columbia in Kanada. Unsere Stadt verfügt über zahlreiche Gemeinschafts- und Freizeiteinrichtungen und bietet viele Einkaufsmöglichkeiten. Da die meisten unserer Einwohner englische Muttersprachler sind, haben die Auslandsschüler/innen hier Gelegenheit, ihr Englisch zu verbessern, während sie in die kanadische Kultur eintauchen.

Außerdem betreiben wir unser eigenes Gastfamilienprogramm. Unsere Gastfamilien werden sorgfältig ausgewählt, um den Aufenthalt unserer Auslandsschüler sicher und angenehm zu gestalten.

- We will acknowledge receipt of your application. A **"Notification of Acceptance" (NOA)** letter will be sent to you by e-mail. Any other applicable forms will be sent to you at this time.
- In order to issue the official **"Letter of Acceptance" (LOA)** and hold your spot at the school, please pay the **"Total Fees"** indicated on the NOA letter immediately.
- Payment and bank information are indicated on the NOA Letter.
- Please fax or e-mail a copy of the wire transfer confirmation to our office after the payment has been made.

Step 4

- When we receive payment in full, we will issue an official "Letter of Acceptance" (LOA) that is required for Study Permit (Visa) application. We will courier the official documents to you.

Homestay:

- We expect that international students will live in an approved local homestay arranged by the Langley School District.
- If other homestay arrangements are going to be made, the Langley School District Office must be contacted first. The Langley School District assumes no liability and will require the parents to sign a waiver.
- Homestay arrangements cannot be made for students under the age of 13. A parent must live with students under the age of 13 for the duration of the school year.

REFUND POLICY

All requests must be made in writing

- a. Full refund, less application fee (\$150), if the Study Permit is not approved by the Canadian Embassy (student must include letter of rejection from the Embassy).
- b. **Two-thirds (2/3)** of \$12,500 Tuition, if the student withdraws prior to the commencement of the program. An earlier refund deadline of the 2nd Friday of June is in effect for Langley Fine Arts School and Langley Fundamental School.
- c. **One-half (1/2)** of \$12,500 Tuition, if the student withdraws any time between commencement of the program and the end of the first calendar month. An earlier refund deadline of the 2nd Friday of July is in effect for Langley Fine Arts School and Langley Fundamental School.
- d. **No refund of fees** if the student withdraws after the first calendar month of the program.
- e. If a student is dismissed from a Langley school, this constitutes dismissal from the entire Langley School District International Student Program. The student is then sent home at the parent's expense and without a refund.
- f. Students receiving Permanent Resident status mid-year (October - June) will not receive a refund.
- g. Students who live with their parents and become Permanent Residents after tuition fees have been paid but before September 30th will receive a full refund less an administrative fee of \$500. Please contact the District office for further details. An earlier refund deadline of the 2nd Friday of June is in effect for Langley Fine Arts School and Langley Fundamental School.

- use or possession of alcohol or illegal drugs
- engaging in illegal activities such as:
 - theft
 - driving without a driver's license (students cannot drive, own, rent or borrow cars. Any motorcycle licenses are not allowed.)
 - gambling
 - possession of weapons and illegal/inappropriate materials
- breach of homestay rules and expectations
- lending or borrowing money
- holding a paying job
- intimidation, bullying and prejudicial behaviour
- harassment and sexual misconduct

International Student Agreement

This document creates a legally binding agreement for participation in the Langley School District's International Program.

Parents: please review this document carefully and initial on Pages 5 and 6 .You and your child must sign and date on Page 7.

Introduction:

The Board of Education of School District No. 35 (Langley) (the "School District"), provides a challenging and dynamic academic program to students studying in our International Programs. This Agreement sets out the terms on which a student is accepted into the program and the obligations on those students and their families.

When this agreement is binding:

This Agreement is not binding upon the School District until it is signed by a parent or guardian of the student and the student applying for admission, is accepted by the School District and an offer of admission is made to the student by the School District, and all program fees are paid.

Placement


While the School District takes into consideration requests for placement at a particular school, the final decision on any placement is determined solely by the School District, taking into account space availability and the appropriate program for the student based on the School District's assessment.

Homestay:

- We expect that international students will live in an approved local homestay arranged by the Langley School District.
- If other homestay arrangements are going to be made, the Langley School District Office must be contacted first. The Langley School District assumes no liability and will require the parents to sign a waiver.
- Homestay arrangements cannot be made for students accepted into grades K-7. A parent must live with students in grades K-7 for the duration of the school year.
- Students and Natural Parents understand, acknowledge and agree to the homestay expectations of Langley School District (these expectations are found on ISP website: <https://studyinlangley.public.sd35.bc.ca/wp-content/uploads/sites/100/2023/04/Homestay-Handbook-05-26-2023.pdf>)

What I am agreeing to:

1. I agree that as a condition of participating in the School District's International Programs that my child:

- a. must comply with the laws of Canada and British Columbia
 - b. must comply with the School and School District Rules, Policies and Code of Conduct;
 - c. must comply with the School District Network and Internet Appropriate Use and Privately Owned Electronic Devices Appropriate Use policies;
 - d. must comply with the terms of this International Student Agreement;
 - e. must not use or possess drugs or alcohol;
 - f. must advise the School District immediately of any change in address/homestay;
 - g. must advise the School district immediately of any change in custodianship;
 - h. cannot drive a motor vehicle even if they hold a valid Driver's License.
 - i. must, if my child is participating in a Homestay, comply with all terms of the Homestay Agreement, and obey family rules and show respect for members of the Homestay family; (<https://studyinlangley.public.sd35.bc.ca/wp-content/uploads/sites/100/2023/04/Homestay-Handbook-05-26-2023.pdf>)
 - j. must not change Homestay arrangements without the consent of the Administrator of International Programs;
 - k. must attend all registered classes in the International Student Program, unless unable by reason of illness or injury to do so and must communicate reason for absence via a Parent, guardian or Homestay family for any absences;
 - l. must not withdraw from courses without consent of school officials, and may not substitute in-class courses for the equivalent online course;
 - m. must complete homework as assigned;
 - n. must not travel outside of Metropolitan Vancouver unless accompanied by an adult of at least 25 years of age. Must complete the student travel form at least 5 working days in advance and receive permission to travel from ISP office prior to any planned travel outside of Metro Vancouver and/or any overnight stays outside of homestay.
 - o. maintain an up-to-date Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) Study Permit if the program requires it;
 - p. submit a complete immunization record. Without such, the student may be prohibited by the BC Ministry of Health from attending school during the infectious stage of an outbreak.
 - q. must arrive with conversational English and be able to understand teacher instructions. While Langley does not ask for IELTS or TOEFL scores, there is a minimum level of language expected for the student to be successful in grades 10 and 11:
 - for students applying to grade 10, the minimum level of IELTS score is 3 or TOEFL is 30-40
 - for students applying to grade 11, the minimum level of IELTS score is 4 or TOEFL is 41-52
2. I represent to the School District that my child has no history of engaging in criminal behaviour or sexual misconduct.
 3. I know of no reason why my child cannot successfully participate in the School District's International Student Program.

How this agreement can be ended:

4. I agree that the School District may end this agreement at any time, without notice and without refunding any tuition paid, and may dismiss and send my child home at my expense if:

- a. any information in my child's application for admission is untrue; including any undisclosed illnesses or medical conditions (including but not limited to; depression, anxiety, eating disorder, suicidal ideation)
- b. my child breaches any of the obligations set out in paragraph 1; or
- c. my child is unable to perform or is not performing to a reasonable academic standard (grade average of less than C- or equivalent).

Fee Schedule and Refund Policy

5. In the event that my child does not come to Canada or decides not to attend or to leave Langley School District's International Programs, I agree that the following terms will apply:

- a. the application fee is non-refundable in any circumstances;
- b. for students in the International Programs, the following will apply:
 - i. the full program fee, less the application fee, will be refunded upon receipt of satisfactory evidence that the Study Permit was not approved by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). Request for refund must include a letter of rejection from the Embassy.
 - ii. two-thirds (2/3) of the full year program fee will be refunded if the student withdraws prior to commencement of program (Program commencement dates are: September 1st, January 1st, February 1st, March 1st or April 1st); An earlier refund deadline of the 2nd Friday of June is in effect for Langley Fine Arts School and Langley Fundamental School.
 - iii. one half (1/2) of the full year program fee, will be refunded if the student withdraws within 30 calendar days of commencing the program (Program commencement dates are: September 1st, January 1st, February 1st, March 1st or April 1st); An earlier refund deadline of the 2nd Friday of July is in effect for Langley Fine Arts School and Langley Fundamental School.
 - iv. no refund will be granted, for any reason, if the student withdraws after the first calendar month of the program.
 - v. If a student is dismissed from a Langley school, this constitutes dismissal from the entire Langley School District International Student Program. The student is then sent home at the parent's expense and without a refund.
 - vi. Students receiving Permanent Resident status mid-year (October - June) will not receive a refund.
 - vii. Students who live with their parents and become Permanent Residents after program fees have been paid but before September 30th will receive a full refund less the processing fee. Please contact the District office for further details. An earlier refund deadline of the 2nd Friday of June is in effect for Langley Fine Arts School and Langley Fundamental School.
 - viii. Students will require approval from Langley International Student Program for any deferral requests. Students can only defer once and there will be no refund if the students withdraw from the deferred intake. All deferrals are subject to a processing fee.

- c. Please note that all refunds are subject to a processing fee and it will take 3-6 weeks for processing once all paperwork has been received.

Insurance

6. The Student is obliged to at all times maintain adequate medical and health insurance while :
- a) in Canada and that the School District is not responsible for any loss or damage suffered by the student as a result of failure to maintain adequate insurance. Students are required to enroll in medical insurance through the International Programs office for the entire duration of their program in Langley School District. If a student cancels or fails to extend their insurance when needed, the School District is not responsible for any loss or damage suffered by the student as a result of failure to maintain adequate insurance.
 - b) New students to Langley are covered by private medical (Guard.me) for 3 months before going on BC MSP. All short-term students are covered by Guard.me for their entire stay. Guard.me does not cover pre-existing conditions, nor does it cover chronic ongoing conditions such as asthma, diabetes, epilepsy, etc. Students with either pre-existing or chronic ongoing conditions must arrive with adequate private insurance, at their own cost, to cover these conditions. Langley School District is not responsible for any loss or damage suffered by the student as a result of failure to have adequate insurance.

Assumption of Risk

7. I understand that there are risks associated with my child enrolling in the School District and that my child will not be under constant supervision. I understand that medical and health emergencies can occur without warning. I voluntarily assume the risk that my child may suffer illness, injury or another emergency and agree that I will not bring any claim against the School District or any of its employees for any injury suffered by my child while participating in the International Programs.
8. I understand that the Student may wish to participate in extracurricular activities such as sports teams, field trips, or school clubs. I give my permission for the Student to participate in such extracurricular activities if the Custodian in their discretion considers such activity appropriate. However, I understand that the School District may not allow my child to participate in high risk activities such as skiing, surfing, snowboarding, mountain climbing, kayaking or canoeing unless I also provide my consent to that activity.

Forum for Dispute Resolution

9. I agree that any dispute arising under the interpretation, application or performance of this agreement or in any way arising out of my child's participation in the School

District's International Programs will be resolved in a British Columbia Court and I agree that I will not bring proceedings in any other court or jurisdiction and irrevocably agree to the jurisdiction of British Columbia courts.

Collection, Use and Disclosure of Personal Information

10. I understand that for the purposes of my child's participation in the School District's International Programs, the School District will collect, use and disclose personal information about me and my child, including information about my child's health and education as well as contact information for me and my child. I understand that that information will be collected, used and disclosed for the purposes of offering and administering the International Programs as permitted by the British Columbia Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act and the British Columbia School Act and may be shared with school authorities, medical and social service providers, homestay providers, custodians and others as required.

11. I agree that under FOIPPA, the School District has the legal authority to collect personal information about students and their families for educational and related purposes. Consent to Medical Treatment

It is understood that this authorization is not given in advance of any specific diagnosis, treatment or hospital care being required but is given to provide authority and power on the part of the School District to give specific consent to any and all such diagnoses, treatment or hospital care such physician may deem advisable.

Release

15. I waive and release all claims against the School District for the injury, loss, damage, accident, delay or expense resulting from my child's participation in the School District's International Programs. I also release the School District and agree to indemnify it, with regard to any financial obligations or liabilities that the School District may incur as a result of claims by others, or that my child may personally incur, or any damage or injury to the person or property of others that my child may cause while participating in the International Programs.
16. I understand that the School District is not responsible for any loss or injury suffered by my child or me. If my child becomes ill or incapacitated, the School District may take such actions as it considers necessary, including securing medical treatment and transporting my child home at his or her own expense. I release the School District from all liability related to such actions.

17. I understand that my child's participation in the International Programs may be terminated at the discretion of the Administrators of the International Programs without any refund of fees, and that my child may be sent home at my expense if he or she does not adhere to the School District rules, standards, and instructions as set forth in the school's agenda, handbook and this Agreement.
18. I agree that the School District is not liable for any loss suffered by my child or me as a result of any labour dispute or other causes beyond its control that may affect the delivery of an educational program.
