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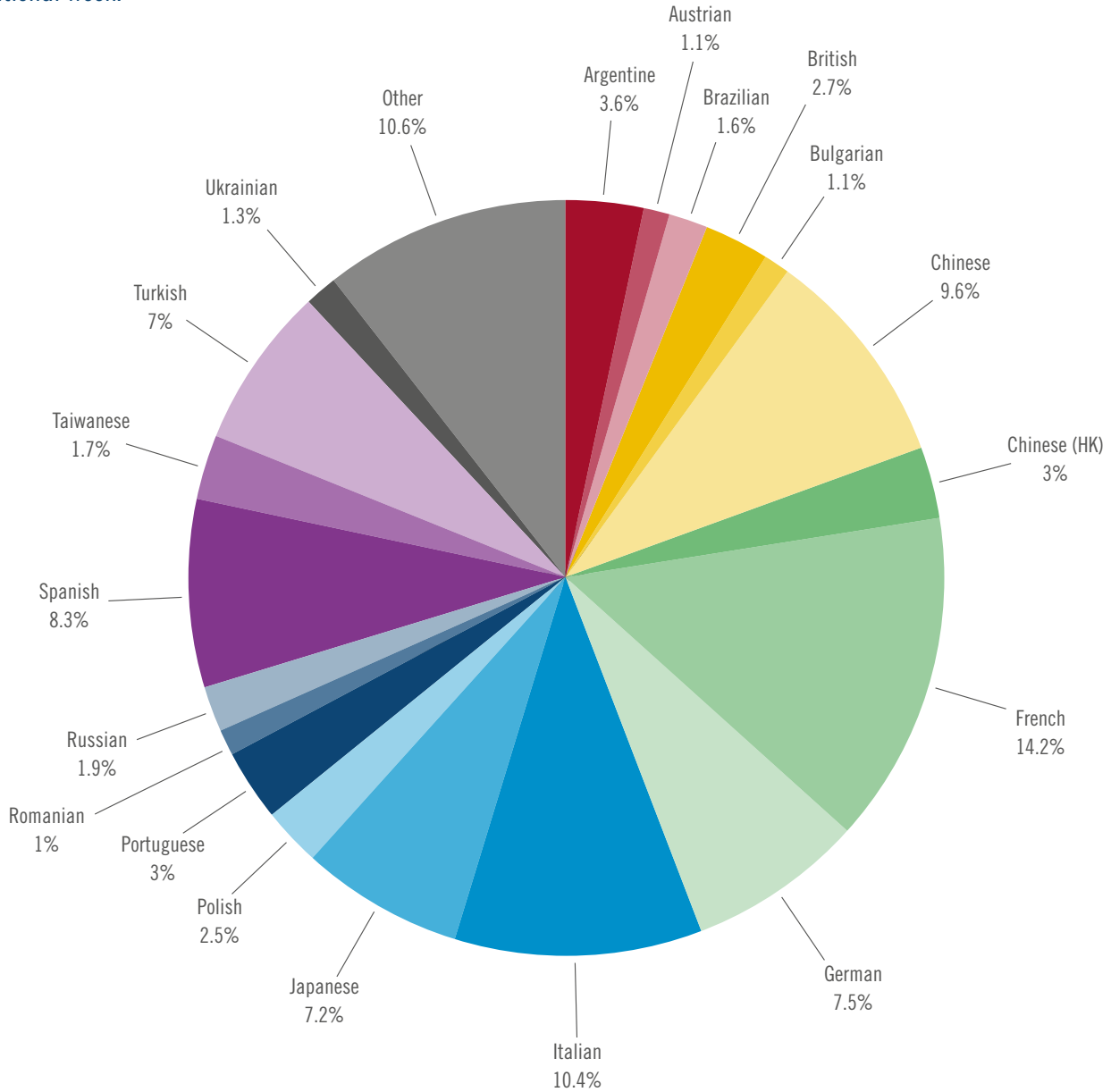

Bede's Foundation



Since our school began, Bede's has had philanthropy rooted at its very core and many pupils have benefited from transformational bursaries, demonstrating that our core ethos of Compassion, Courage, Conscientiousness and Curiosity is a living and breathing part of everything that we do. In September 2022 we created the Bede's Transformational Bursary Fund, and in June 2023 launched the Bede's Development Foundation.

The mission of this campaign is to create in excess of twenty 110% Sixth Form transformational bursaries by 2029; the Senior School's 50th anniversary at The Dicker. A Bede's transformational bursary is worth 110% and targets those from the most disadvantaged backgrounds and covers a pupil's fees, transport, uniform and co-curricular programme so that they face no barrier to the opportunities Bede's provides when they take up their place with us. Making our bursaries truly transformational.

For every week booked at the Bede's Summer School, £20 of that booking will be donated to the Bede's Transformations Bursary Fund, which means together the Summer School will fund two 110% transformational bursaries a year for those most in need.

Staff at Bede's

We recognise the key role staff play in making the student experience at Bede's Summer School special and memorable. That's why Bede's carefully selects our staff to ensure they are friendly and enthusiastic, with the skills, experience and passion to bring out the best from the students in our care.

Each centre has a minimum of four senior managers on site:

- Centre Director, who oversees all aspects of the school;
- Academic Manager, who ensures the delivery of engaging and motivating academic programmes;
- Welfare Manager, who looks after the students physical and emotional well-being; and
- Activities Manager, who is responsible for a varied, enjoyable and inspiring programme of sports, activities, academies, social events and excursions.

Every member of staff receives a thorough induction to make sure they are fully equipped for their roles. All staff are residential, so students receive 24-hour supervision and many of the staff return year after year, which helps Bede's to provide a high standard of pastoral care to students.

Bede's aim is to inspire students, widening their horizons and giving them opportunities to make international friendships, whilst also improving their English language skills.

Safeguarding & Student Care



Safeguarding and the health and well-being of our students is the top priority across St Bede's Trust Sussex. We are led by Annabel Hodge, Director of Safeguarding and Designated Safeguarding Lead, who oversees all the training of Summer School staff to ensure that everyone is aware of their role and responsibility in keeping students safe.

A qualified Registered Nurse is on site at each centre to provide medical care and dispense medicines. We ask parents/guardians to notify us in advance of any pre-existing conditions and prescription drug needs. Many of the staff are first aid trained so they are able to deal with small incidents which may occur during activities and excursions. An emergency 24/7 contact number is provided to every student and parent/guardian.

Students are looked after day and night by our on-site, dedicated staff. Each centre has a Welfare Manager and a team of House Parents who work closely together to make sure students feel happy and supported during their stay.

Academic Programme

At Bede's Summer School we deliver excellence in student academic programmes. Students can learn and develop their love of English through stimulating lessons taught by qualified, enthusiastic and committed teachers.

Each of our centres and courses has a closely defined age range that facilitates the design and delivery of a relevant, challenging and constructive syllabus in line with the Bede's mission, where students can enjoy multicultural classes with a 20% language cap on student enrolments to ensure a diverse international student community.



LESSONS

Each course has a different academic curriculum tailored to the age range of the centre. The number of hours of English tuition will also vary depending on the course. Please visit the relevant course pages in the prospectus for further information.

PLACEMENT TEST

Students will take a placement test on arrival to confirm their English level. They will then be placed into appropriate classes according to their level and age at the start of the programme. Bede's will apply a 20% language cap to promote cultural diversity and ensure a high degree of English immersion within the classroom.

PROGRESS TEST

Progress tests are carried out by the teachers at the end of each week to monitor and review students' progress and make any necessary adjustments for the following week.

Under the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR), eight levels are available from A0 (Complete Beginner) to C2 (Proficiency). If a Course or Academy has a minimum requirement it will be stated on the supplementary information.

SYLLABUS

The Bede's syllabus offers varied, current and relevant topics to engage, motivate and inspire students. The syllabus is tailored to students' ages, needs and interests to ensure efficient learning.

METHODOLOGY

All English teachers are suitably qualified according to the Accreditation UK criteria. The teaching methodology is communicative and interactive, with creativity and personal expression encouraged. Students participate actively in enjoyable and engaging activities to encourage confidence in spoken English.

OUTCOMES

We present course completion certificates and achievement awards in our Leavers' Ceremony, not just for academic achievement, but also to recognise effort and improvement.

TUTORIALS

Tutorials are available on Friday afternoons, giving students the opportunity to discuss their academic progress with their Teachers.




Exams

Bede’s Summer School offers a number of intensive exam courses to allow students to obtain a professional qualification to certify their English level in preparation for future academic study or for their future career.

All exam courses are run as two-week programmes and include dedicated exam preparation instead of regular English lessons. Students sit the exam during their Bede’s course, normally in the last week.

All exam registration fees are included in the exam course fee. Special arrangements need to be requested with a minimum of 8 weeks advance, subject to availability.

On-site Activities

At Bede's Summer School, we believe that students learn just as much outside of the classroom as they do inside of it. Our on-site activity programme is key to this. Bede's Summer School understands that all students have different interests. With that in mind, our programmes are designed to have something for everyone that works to the social and cultural benefit of our students combining sports, arts and crafts and challenging competitions.

Each of our boarding school summer centres has an on-site indoor swimming pool, sports hall and fields, as well as multipurpose indoor spaces for showcases and workshops to host the wide array of activities that students will enjoy. Our superb sites allow us to offer varied and exciting activities and evening events in first class surroundings.

Excursions are an integral part of the Bede's Summer School programme and no two weeks are ever the same! We offer students a complimentary mix of visits to places of cultural and historical interest, as well as chances for sightseeing, shopping and amusement.

With our carefully defined age ranges, excursions across the summer are tailored to the interests of students and are age-appropriate.

Depending on the centre, students will go on excursions either three or four times a week. Mid-week trips include half-day afternoon or full-day visits and involve visiting a local place of interest in a

nearby town or an off-site activity, making the most of the wonderful local and natural attractions across the South East of England.

Saturday excursions are a full-day trip and include a cultural, touristic or recreational visit to London. A sightseeing option is offered every week to ensure that students get the chance to experience the capital's most famous landmarks.

Sunday excursions are often more relaxing trips to a local Sussex seaside town such as Eastbourne, Brighton or Hastings. Students can walk along the beach, have lunch in the park or do some shopping whilst enjoying the sights and attractions on offer.

09.00 ENGLISH SKILLS 1+2 (WITH A 15MIN BREAK)

These lessons are designed to develop students' English language proficiency across the four skills with a particular focus on the global problems we are facing nowadays, as well as better their understanding of grammar and extend their vocabulary.

11.15 BREAK + SNACK

11.30 COMMUNICATION SKILLS

Students will be able to practise their communication skills through a variety of tasks and communication techniques.

12.30 LUNCH

Our Dicker centre offers a mixture of modern and traditional dining areas for students to enjoy a lunch prepared by the award-winning Holroyd Howe. Staff will be on hand to help students understand all the options available.

SPORTS & ACTIVITIES

After lessons, students participate in a variety of sports and recreational activities, e.g. Capture the Flag, Yoga, Football and Arts & Crafts.

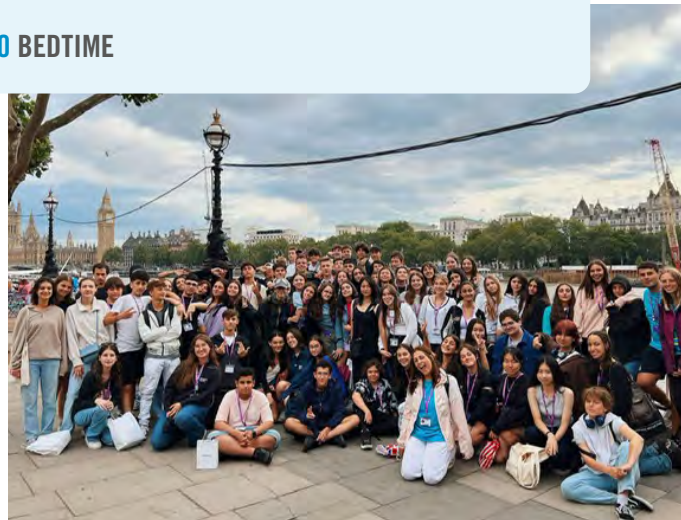

With a beautiful setting at the foot of Beachy Head, an area of outstanding natural beauty, our Eastbourne centre overlooks the sea and is the term-time home of Bede's Preparatory School. This compact centre, founded as the first Bede's School in 1895, has the feel of a family home and offers a safe and welcoming environment for our youngest students. The academic, social and cultural programme is carefully designed to educate and inspire our youngest learners.

The Little Explorers course is full of lessons, activities, events and excursions that give students a great introduction to the UK. Lessons are in small classes with a syllabus and materials perfect for young learners. Activities make use of our outstanding facilities and are designed around the interests of younger students.

The evening entertainment programme provides an opportunity for recreation and fun and is designed to immerse students in the English language and culture in a stimulating and innovative way.

Excursions enable students to visit places of interest. Students will go on a half-day trip on Wednesday afternoons and full-day trips on Saturdays and Sundays to our exciting range of historic, cultural and fun attractions and destinations.

Academics

This carefully crafted programme, with 17½ hours of lessons per week, consists of English Skills, StoryTime and Explorations, where students learn English through stimulating subjects such as Science, Technology, Geography and History.

Lessons improve students' general language competencies (including grammar and vocabulary) while placing particular emphasis on communication, fluency and building confidence in the speaker.

LEVELS & CLASSES

All levels are welcome, starting from A0 (Complete Beginner) up to C2 (Proficiency). To ensure the best possible outcome in lessons, our academic team places students in classes based on their level, age and nationality.

ENGLISH SKILLS

These lessons are designed to improve students' general language skills, extend their vocabulary and better their understanding of grammar, to improve accuracy when producing spoken and written English.

STORYTIME

Working on several different children's stories per week, StoryTime lessons stimulate students' natural curiosity, develop their listening and speaking skills and extend their everyday vocabulary.

EXPLORATIONS

These lessons use CLIL methodology to develop students' English skills through a range of stimulating subjects such as Science, Technology, Geography and History.

Day Course

Bede's Day Course, offered at Eastbourne, is a non-residential option for students who are coming to England with their parents/guardians on a family holiday.

PROGRAMME

The programme runs from 08.30 to 17.00 Monday to Friday (18.00 on Wednesday) and includes the half-day excursion on Wednesdays. Students may add the evening option (includes dinner and evening social events) on a daily basis and may also join the Saturday and Sunday excursions (supplements payable, see Registration Form for details).

LESSONS & ACTIVITIES

Day students will join the residential students in classes which are mixed to ensure they are learning with peers of different nationalities and of the same language ability and age. Day students will also join the varied and exciting on-site activity programme offered as part of the Little Explorers course, or can add any of the available Academies onto their Day Course.

ACCOMMODATION

We recommend you stay in Eastbourne, which is a popular seaside town on the South Coast of England, with many seafront hotels offering beautiful views across the coastline. There is something to suit every

budget, from self-catering apartments to deluxe 5-star hotels. You need to book your own accommodation.

BEDE'S HOLIDAY CLUB

Bede's Holiday Club is a day activity camp for local British children to spend their summer at Bede's Eastbourne making friends with our Little Explorers!

Summer School students have the opportunity to interact during breaks, afternoon activities and mealtimes with children from the local community. This will help build their confidence and provide excellent practice for their English skills in real life scenarios.

ENGLISH LESSONS

English Skills focus on developing students' general knowledge in English and ability to communicate effectively and accurately in everyday situations and different contexts. Students will be tested, challenged, supported and stimulated.

10.45 BREAK + SNACK

11.00 STORYTIME

StoryTime gives students the opportunity to share personal and fictional stories in a creative and stimulating way, enhancing their spoken fluency in English. Students become storytellers and story listeners, with the StoryTime teacher as their role model.

12.00 SIESTA/CHILL 'N' CHAT

Siesta Time or Chill 'n' Chat is included to allow our youngest students to re-energise in preparation for a busy afternoon of sports and activities.

12.30 LUNCH

Our Eastbourne centre offers a beautiful dining experience overlooking the sea. Students will be able to enjoy their lunch prepared by the award-winning Holroyd Howe. Staff will be on hand to help students.

13.30 EXPLORATIONS

These CLIL-based (Content and Language Integrated Learning) lessons allow students to improve their English whilst at the same time explore a range of stimulating subjects such as Ecology, Space, Science and Technology.

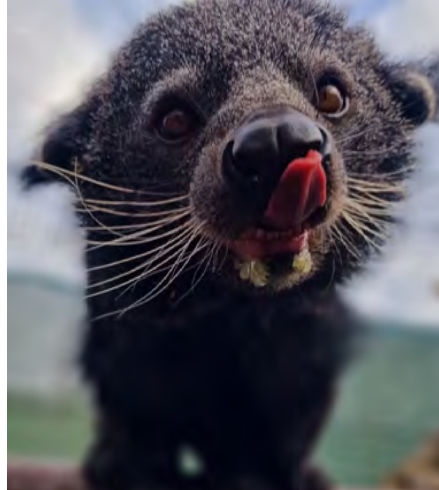


BEDE'S ZOO

Situated at Bede's Senior School, Dicker, the Zoo is home to about 70 different species of mammals, birds, amphibians, reptiles, fish and invertebrates. Catering for their individual enrichment needs can be quite a challenge as each animal has different requirements, as a snake isn't going to need the same enrichment as a Squirrel Monkey. As a school, we are enormously lucky to have such a facility in our portfolio. In animal management, students look after a range of zoo animals, and help with the dormouse breeding programme to increase numbers in the wild.

ENGLISH LEVELS

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

Students learn about animal welfare and ethics, animal health and disease, animal behaviour, practical animal husbandry and work experience in the land-based sector.

ANIMAL CARE & BEHAVIOUR

We feel that a connection with animals is enriching, calming and fulfilling. Feeding mealworms to a gecko, trying to exercise a kinkajou, or listening to the calls of our primates – brings something to the lives of the young people who are privileged to be able to enjoy these opportunities.

ANIMAL HANDLING

Students look at wildlife conservation, both in captivity and in the wild, the ethics of keeping animals in captivity, how to health check their pets, and perhaps most enjoyably – take part in animal handling and feeding sessions, e.g. they are able to spend time feeding the white faced owl, cleaning out the Royal Pythons' vivarium, or rearranging the branching in the home of the Siberian Chipmunks.

Students on the **English for the Future (Coast)** course will develop their critical thinking and problem-solving skills through exploring the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, and will debate as future leaders how to take action and transform the world around them. Students on the **Pathways to Higher Education** course will follow a more intensive academic programme with a focus on exploring the language needed in university contexts as well as a specific subject area in order to fully engage themselves in their preferred field. 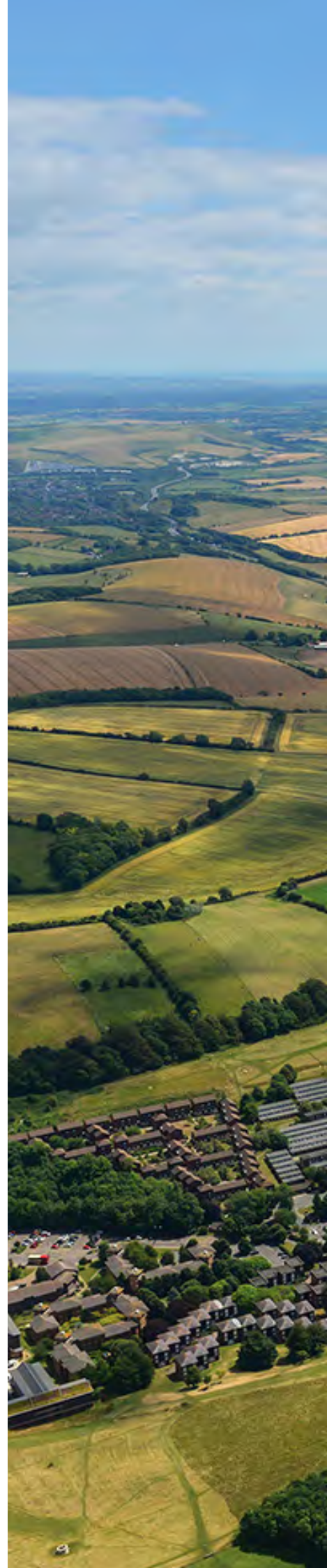



ENGLISH FOR THE FUTURE (COAST)

This innovative study programme, with 20 hours of lessons per week, is specially designed for older teenagers who want to discuss the greatest global challenges as leaders of the future and take action to transform our world.

Academics

LEVELS

Five levels are available at Brighton from A2 (Pre-Intermediate) to C2 (Proficiency).

ENGLISH FOR THE FUTURE

10 hours per week The morning English for the Future sessions develop the students' English language proficiency across the four skills with a particular focus on the global problems we are facing nowadays. Students will develop their presentation skills by watching TED Talks and preparing their own talks, as well as broadening their vocabulary related to sustainability and global issues.

FUTURE THINKING

5.5 hours per week These sessions prepare students for 'Friday for the Future' debates between two classes. Through a series of practical workshops on internet research and critical thinking, students will gather sufficient information on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and analyse it in order to offer practical solutions to global problems.

PROJECT FOR THE FUTURE

4.5 hours per week Over the course of a week, students will research and discuss one of the 2030 Agenda Sustainable Development Goals such as ending poverty and hunger, protecting the planet, promoting and fostering peace, achieving gender equality and empowering all women and girls. Then they will present their conclusions by way of writing a blog entry or a news story, conducting a survey and analysing its findings or presenting a sketch or performance. These sessions aim to develop not only students' speaking and communication skills but also their social and interpersonal skills, as well as broaden their perspectives on life in the future.

These include essay writing, note-taking, lectures, seminars and presentations.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS

5 hours per week These sessions prepare students for life in Higher Education through highly practical workshops that enable more effective methods for high-level oral and written communication. This will be delivered through a wide range of professional and academic contexts, and can involve debating, problem-solving, presenting, essay writing, critical thinking or negotiating.

ENGLISH FOR SPECIFIC PATHWAYS

10 hours per week These sessions are themed around the specific pathway that the student has chosen, and provide both an introduction to their chosen discipline as well as the language skills necessary to develop their understanding of it. Bede's offers a year round co-educational boarding experience for pupils from age 10 to 18 at both its Prep School on the coast in Eastbourne, and at its Senior School, a short distance away in Upper Dicker. 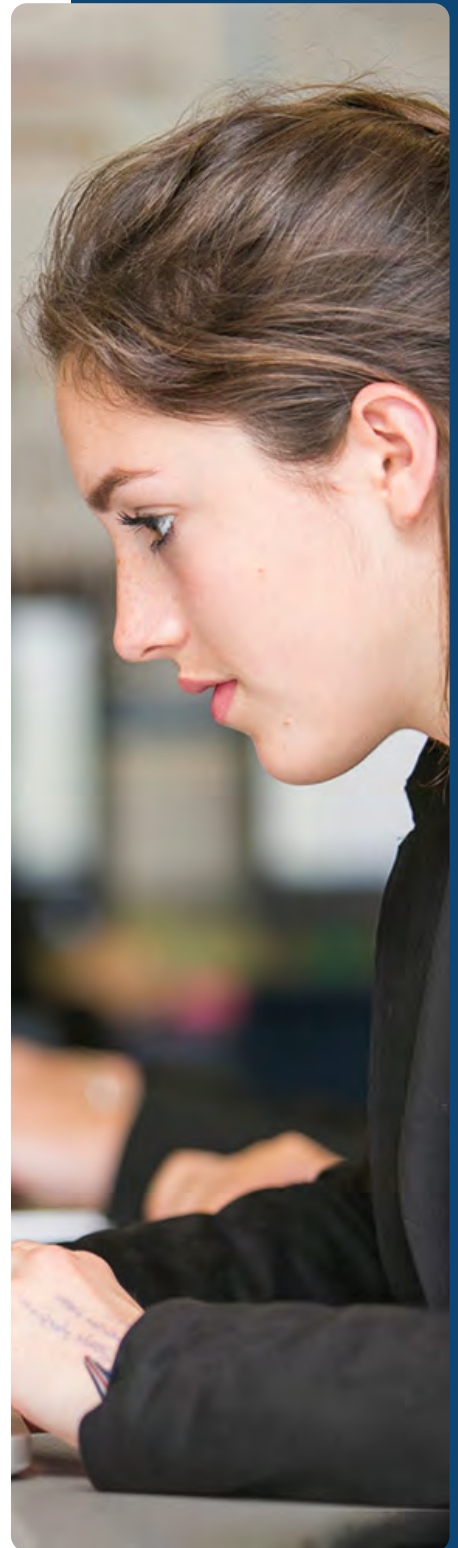

BEDE'S EXTRAORDINARY SUMMER SCHOOL

1 TERMINOLOGY

- 1.1 The Summer School:** means the language, activity and cultural courses and experiences offered by the School trading as Bede's Summer School. The Summer School also comprises the spring Easter Course.
- 1.2 The School:** means St Bede's School Trust Sussex, of the Dicker, Upper Dicker, Hailsham, East Sussex BN27 3QH as now or in the future constituted (and any successor). The School is constituted as a charitable company limited by guarantee, registered with charity number 278950 and company number 01386499. The School is registered with VAT number 621 6539 49.
- 1.3 The Parent or You:** means any person who has signed the Registration Form and/or who has accepted responsibility for a child's attendance at this Summer School.
- 1.4 Student:** means the child named on the Registration Form and/or the child who attends the Summer School.
- 1.5 Deposit:** means the amount payable to the School in order to complete the registration procedure. Once received by the School, the Deposit will be deducted from the balance of fees payable by the Parent.
- 1.6 The Registration Form:** means the Registration Form provided by the School or its agent for the purpose of booking a place for the Student at the Summer School.

2 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 2.1 These Terms and Conditions:** In all cases, irrespective of whether the Parent completes the Summer School Registration Form or a Registration Form provided by an agent, these Terms and Conditions will apply to the agreement between the School and the Parent and will supersede any Terms and Conditions provided by the agent.
- 2.2 Enrolment procedure:** The Parent understands and agrees that:
- 2.2.1** They can request a place for their child by sending the School a completed Registration Form and the Deposit of £600 for Residential courses, or £250 for Non-Residential courses.
- 2.2.2** Once a Registration Form has been received and the details checked and confirmed, a reservation will be made for that child. A reservation does not constitute a booking and is not a legally binding contract between the Parent and the School.

- 2.2.4** Where the Parent is using an online Registration Form, the Parent will receive a Confirmation Letter by email should the online booking be accepted by the School. - 2.2.5** The School will keep a copy of the contract between the School and the Parent.
- 2.3 Academies** The Parent understands and agrees that:
- 2.3.1** An Academy place must be requested when the Parent completes the Registration Form.
- 2.3.2** Academies are subject to a minimum number of enrolments; if an Academy is cancelled, the Parent will be offered a refund of the Academy fee only.
- 2.3.3** Once the Academy fees have been paid in full, no changes or refunds can be guaranteed.

- 2.13 Liability and disclaimer:** The Parent understands and agrees that:
- 2.13.1** The School shall not be liable in the event that any service contracted becomes impossible to supply due to reasons beyond its control.
- 2.13.2** All organised sports, activities, clubs, events, trips and excursions have been risk assessed by School staff and are deemed to meet health & safety requirements. The School does not accept responsibility for accidents or sports injuries, except in cases where its staff have been found to be negligent.
- 2.13.3** If the Parent does not wish the Student to partake in any particular activity, they must inform the School in writing at the time of booking.
- 2.13.4** The School can take any fair and reasonable action it considers appropriate should a situation arise which is not covered by these Terms and Conditions.

- 2.14 Exams:**
- 2.14.1** The Parent may provisionally enrol the Student for an exam using the Registration Form – all boxes must be filled in duly or else registration will not be possible. Exam places are subject to availability.
- 2.14.2** Once an exam place is requested (Cambridge English exams only), the Student will complete an online placement test. The exam place will only be confirmed to Students who have the required level, as decided by the Summer School. Exam places are offered at the sole discretion of the Summer School.
- 2.14.3** Students enrolled onto an exam must bring the copy of the original passport used to register for the exam.
- 2.14.4** Once an exam place has been confirmed by the Summer School, the full exam fee listed in the Registration Form becomes payable. The exam fee includes the Summer School's fee for providing exam preparation, the exam registration fee and transport to the exam venue (if required).
- 2.14.5** The Exam Cancellation Policy is as follows:
- (a) 56 days or more prior to the course start date, exam fee is refunded in full
- (b) 0–55 days, or after the course has started, the full exam fee is payable
- 2.14.6** Examinations will be held at the School or at a local external testing centre; transport will be provided by the School if necessary.
- 2.14.7** Exam certificates will be sent by the School to the Parent, the cost of which is included in the exam fee. If the Parent does not receive a certificate, he/she must inform the School no later than 6 months after the date of the exam.
- 2.14.8** If a Student has special requests for the exam, these must be requested in advance, preferably at the time of enrolment, and no less than 8 weeks before the exam, with supporting medical certificates that must be in English. Any certificates supplied after this deadline will not guarantee special arrangements.
- 2.14.9** Please note that exam courses are subject to a minimum number of enrolments, a full refund for exam fees will be issued in case of cancellation.
- 2.14.10** Exam registration closes on 5th June 2024. Places are on a request only basis after this date and the School cannot guarantee a place.

- 2.15 Pocket money:**
- 2.15.1** Subject to clause 2.13, the School shall not be liable for the safety or security of any pocket money, which is brought to the School by Students:
- (a) that is not handed in to the Summer School for safekeeping upon a Student's arrival at the Centre; or
- (b) which is in the Student's possession.

- 2.16 Students Out of Age Range:**
- 2.16.1** Bede's has developed age ranges suitable to the campuses and courses that the School delivers. The School is not obligated to accept any students out of age range. In exceptional circumstances where certain criterion is met, requests will be considered on an individual basis and risk assessed by the Summer School Director, who will make the final decision.
- 2.16.2** These requests will not be considered for students more than one year older or younger than the published age range of any centre or course offered by the School.

3 PAYMENTS

- 3.1 Payment of Fees:** The Parent undertakes to pay the balance of the fees no less than 56 days before the start of the course (the "Invoice Due Date"). If the booking is requested less than 56 days before the start of a course, then full payment must be received at the time of booking. The Student will not be permitted to attend the Summer School until all fees and any planned extra costs are paid in full as cleared funds to the School.
- 3.1.1** If you do not make any payment due to the School by the Invoice Due Date, the School may charge interest to you on the overdue amount at the rate of 3% a year above the base lending rate of Barclays Bank from time to time. This interest shall accrue on a daily basis from the Invoice Due Date until the date of actual payment of the overdue amount, whether before or after judgment. The Parent must pay the School interest together with any overdue amount. The School may also take any other action (including, but not limited to, the instigation of proceedings in any court of its choosing) if considers appropriate to recover any sums due and unpaid and any costs the School incurs in so doing will be payable by the Parent.
- 3.2 Credit card payment:** All credit card payments must be made by the Parent online via the Summer School's secure payment portal. Visit www.bedessummerschool.org. Any credit card details received by the Summer School via email will not be used for payment purposes and will be destroyed.
- 3.3 Impromptu expenses:** The Parent agrees that the School shall not be obliged to make payments for impromptu expenses (such as doctor's fees) on behalf of the Student or the Parent. Where such payments are required, the Parent agrees for appropriate payments to be covered by the student. Should funds be insufficient or unavailable, the Parent shall make payment in advance by credit card.

4 EARLY DEPARTURE, CANCELLATION AND INSURANCE

- 4.1 Early departure:** If the Parent decides to withdraw the Student from the Summer School, or if the Student withdraws him/herself prior to the departure date shown on the Registration Form, they may do so on the understanding that no refund of fees paid will be made, save in exceptional circumstances. Should a transfer be necessary, the School will require a minimum notice period of 24 hours which takes effect from the time the School receives the notification. An irregular transfer fee of £140 will be payable by the Parent in advance.
- 4.1.1** Exceptional circumstances include but are not limited to:
- (a) a serious breach of these Terms and Conditions by the School
- (b) cases of serious illness or genuine hardship
- 4.1.2** Any refund is given at the sole discretion of the Summer School Director.
- 4.2 Cancellation policy:** If the Parent needs to cancel the Student's course for any reason, they must inform the School in writing immediately. Cancellation takes effect from the date when the School receives this notification. Subject to clause 4.3, cancellation charges are as follows:
- 4.2.1** 56 days or more prior to course start date Full fees refunded
- 4.2.2** 29 to 55 days prior to course start date Deposit retained
- 4.2.3** 8 to 28 days prior to course start date 1 week's fee retained
- 4.2.4** 0 to 7 days prior to course start date Full fees retained (no refund available)
- 4.2.5** After start of course Full fees retained (no refund available)
- 4.3 Insurance:** The School does not accept responsibility for any claims arising from a student or third party. Insurance (with Endsleigh Insurance) is provided for all students attending a Summer School course as part of the package. The Parent is referred to the Significant Features and Benefits detailed on the Table of Benefits.
- 4.4 Making an insurance claim:** Should the need arise, the Parent understands and agrees that they are responsible for making an insurance claim by completing the required paperwork in English and by providing the necessary documentary evidence to support the claim. The Parent agrees that:
- 4.4.1** The School cannot make claims on behalf of the Parent.
- 4.4.2** The School will provide a Claims Form at the Parent's request.

5 HEALTH AND WELFARE

- 5.1 Student's health:** The Parent warrants that the Student is in good physical and mental health and is not travelling against the advice of any doctor or qualified healthcare professional. The Parent agrees to inform the School when completing the Registration Form if the Student suffers from any pre-existing medical condition, disability or allergy.
- 5.2 Medication:** The Parent agrees that any medicine brought to the School by the Student will be given to the Welfare Manager or Centre Director on arrival. The School shall only accept responsibility for medicines which are licensed in the UK, prescribed by a doctor and which are accompanied by English translation. Such medication shall be properly stored and administered by the Welfare Manager or Nurse, or by any authorised person who is expressly appointed to administer medicines by the Summer School Director.
- 5.3 Illness:** In case of illness or injury, the Student will see the Welfare Manager or School Nurse who will assess his/her condition. In cases of minor illness such as a cold, headache or sore throat, the Welfare Manager, School Nurse or any other person expressly authorised by the Summer School Director may issue common, non-prescribed medicines such as Paracetamol, throat lozenges or cough syrup. Only qualified nurses or First Aiders may practise First Aid.
- 5.3.1** If the Welfare Manager or School Nurse considers that a doctor's visit is necessary, an appointment will be made with a local GP.
- 5.3.2** If the Student requires urgent medical attention, the School's staff will take him/her to the nearest local hospital for immediate care or if necessary, will telephone for an ambulance.
- 5.4 Emergency medical treatment:** The Parent authorises the Summer School Director, Assistant Director, Centre Director or Welfare Manager to consent on their behalf to the Student receiving emergency medical treatment including blood transfusions, general anaesthetic and operations where certified by an appropriately qualified person as necessary for the Student's welfare and if the Parent cannot be contacted in time.
- 5.5 Seeing a doctor:** Students from most non-EEA countries are not entitled to free healthcare in the UK and will therefore have to pay a fee to see a doctor. In such cases the Parent agrees that the fees will be paid from the Student's money. Medical Expense Cover is included in the insurances conveyed by the School. All students from EEA countries or Switzerland who are eligible for an EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) should bring this card with them to cover the cost of any medical treatment.
- 5.6 Medical Certificates:** The Parent agrees to inform the School and pay the relevant fee in advance if they require the Student to be issued with a Medical Certificate following a visit to a doctor or hospital.
- 5.7 Supervision of Students:** The School's staff live and sleep in the same boarding houses as the Students. Students are therefore supervised day and night. Each boarding house is managed by an appointed House Parent who is responsible for the day-to-day running of the House and for the Students' general well-being.
- 5.8 Student's accommodation:** The School reserves the right to organise the Student's accommodation as it deems appropriate and taking account of student numbers, the ratio of girls and boys and the available boarding accommodation. The rights and freedoms of individual students will be respected.
- 5.8.1 Bedroom Requests:** The School will consider all reasonable accommodation requests made by the Parent. All requests are subject to availability and are at the School's entire discretion.

6 AIRPORT TRANSFERS

6.1 The course confirmation will include a Transfer Service Form which the Parent must complete and return to the School at least one month before the course starts. Upon receipt of the completed form, the School will send the Parent an email confirmation of the flight details. The Parent understands that:

- 6.1.1** It is his/her responsibility to check this confirmation carefully and to let the School know of any errors or changes.
- 6.1.2** The School will not accept responsibility for organising transfers other than those which have been confirmed by the School.
- 6.1.3** The School will use private transport such as Coach, Taxi or School Minibus to transfer students to and from the airport or train station on arrival or departure. Public transport such as the train and London Underground may be used on occasions where this method of transport is considered to be more appropriate, efficient or effective.
- 6.1.4** Transfers from the airport to the Summer School Centre are often organised in groups and this means that some students will be required to wait at the airport for other students arriving on different flights.
- 6.1.5** Unexpected and unavoidable delays and complications sometimes occur. The School does not accept responsibility for any loss or expense due to delays or changes in public transport beyond its control.
- 6.1.6** The School shall use its reasonable endeavours to ensure that Students reach the airport or the train station in the UK on time to enable them to catch their flight or their train. Subject to this, the School shall have no liability for any direct or indirect loss or expense that is incurred by Students or Parents if a Student misses a flight or a train. Nothing in this clause shall exclude or restrict the School's liability for death or personal injury arising from its own negligence, or for fraud.

6.1.7 The Student is liable for any excess baggage and UM (Unaccompanied Minor) charges.

6.1.8 There is no reduction in fees if the Student does not require a transfer service.

6.1.9 Should a transfer be requested or changed within 7 days of arrival or departure, a Late Transfer Arrangement Fee of £95 will be payable.

6.1.10 On departure, if a flight/train is cancelled and the Student is required to stay at or return to the centre, the charges per night as stated in section 3.4 will be payable by the Parent. A free return transfer to any airport/train station included in the course fees will be offered.

6.1.11 The airport transfer service included in the price does not incur any extra charges for arrivals on Sunday and departures on Saturday between 9am and 6pm to and from London Gatwick and London Heathrow Airports or between 10 am and 5 pm for London St Pancras. An Irregular Hours/Days fee of £140 (one way) will be applied for arrivals and departures outside of the advertised window and on different days. On demand, airport transfer services to and from Stansted, Luton and London City Airports may be organised (subject to availability) and an Irregular Airport fee of £295 will be applied each way.

7 TRANSPORT

7.1 The School will use private transport such as Coach, Taxi or School Minibus to transfer students from and to the Centre for the purposes of airport transfers, off-site trips, excursions and other activities as required. Public transport such as trains and local buses may be used on occasions where this method of transport is considered to be more appropriate, efficient or effective.

8 SCHOOL RULES

- 8.1 Eastbourne, Windlesham, Dicker, Lancing and Royal Russell:** If students participating in these programmes do not follow the School rules as set out in the Student Handbook, the School reserves the right to discipline them. Parents understand and agree that:
- 8.1.1** In cases of persistent misbehaviour or rudeness, for very serious incidents, or if a student breaks the UK law, then he/she will be excluded from the Summer School immediately. A copy of the Behaviour Policy can be found on our website and is available upon request.
- 8.1.2** All Eastbourne, Windlesham, Dicker, Lancing and Royal Russell courses are non-smoking and the School accepts bookings from Parents on the understanding that the Student does not smoke at any time while attending the Summer School, whether at the School, on off-site trips, excursions or other activities.
- 8.1.3** The Summer School Behaviour Policy contains further details.
- 8.2 Brighton:** The Student is expected to conduct him/herself responsibly and abide by the rules as written in the Student Handbook. The Parent understands and agrees that:
- 8.2.1** Students aged 16 and over can smoke in designated areas and students over 18 are allowed to drink alcohol during their free time or during organised social events, but that a mature and responsible approach must be adopted at all times. No alcohol can be brought nor consumed on campus, regardless of Student's age.
- 8.2.2** If the Student's conduct in relation to smoking or drinking alcohol is considered excessive by a member of staff, the School may discipline the Student in accordance with its Behaviour Policy.
- 8.2.3** Any instances of drug use will be followed up with the police.
- 8.3** If the School in its entire discretion considers that the Student should be excluded from the Summer School no refund of fees shall be paid and any alternative accommodation or transport arrangements required as a result of the exclusion shall be the responsibility of the Parent and the Parent agrees that it will reimburse the School in respect of any additional costs the School may incur as a result of any exclusion.

9 VISAS

- 9.1** In cases where the Student is required to obtain a visa to study in the UK, a Visa Invitation Letter will be provided by the School. The Parent understands that visas must be applied for immediately upon receipt of the Invitation Letter and that it is the responsibility of the Parent to apply for the appropriate visa.
- 9.2** If the Parent cancels the contract as a result of a visa application being refused, the School shall refund the full fees paid (less a £250 administration fee) upon receipt of a copy of the original documentation issued by the Entry Clearance Officer. The cancellation charges of clause 4.2 will not apply in these circumstances.
- 9.3** If a visa has not arrived in advance of the Student's course start date, the School will offer to postpone the course to a later date, subject to availability. If the Student attends the course but the same number of course weeks is not available, the School will refund the fees of any untaken weeks.
- 9.4** If the Parent decides to cancel the course due to a delay in the issuing of a visa, the School will refund the full fees paid (less one week's course fees). The cancellation charges of clause 4.2 will not apply in these circumstances.
- 9.5** If a student is found to have the wrong type of visa, he/she will not be admitted on to the programme. In this case, the School will not be obliged to offer the Parent a refund of fees, although cases of genuine hardship may receive special consideration upon written request to the Summer School Director.

10 COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE

- 10.1 Complaints:** The Parent understands and agrees that:
- 10.1.1** If they are not happy with any aspect of School service, they must let the School know so that it has the opportunity to investigate and rectify the situation.
- 10.1.2** If the Student has an issue / a concern, he/she shall speak to the School staff straight away in order for them to deal with the problem.
- 10.1.3** If the issue / concern is not resolved promptly by School staff, the Student or Parent may speak to the Centre Director.
- 10.1.4** If the Parent would like to make an official complaint, they should request a copy of the Summer School's Complaints Procedure or visit www.bedessummerschool.org
- 10.1.5** If the Parent would like to request an independent review, they may wish to contact English UK. **Phone:** 020 7608 7960 **Email:** info@englishuk.com

11 DATA PROTECTION

- 11.1** The School holds information about the Parent and Student including parent and guardian contact details, financial information, details of medical conditions and where relevant, exam results. This information is kept electronically on the School's Management Information System.
- 11.2** These notes refer to the "processing" of information. "Processing" is a catch-all term and means obtaining or recording information or carrying out any operation on the information such as storing or using the information or passing it onto third parties.
- 11.3** The School processes information about the Parent and the Student in order to safeguard and promote the Students' welfare, promote the objects and interests of the School, facilitate the efficient operation of the Summer School and ensure that all relevant legal obligations of the School are complied with. Examples may include: the School keeping details of medical conditions from which the Student may suffer so that staff will be able to respond appropriately in the event of a medical emergency, and/or the School processing financial information obtained from the Parent or from third parties such as Agents or travel agencies. The School may also process information such as photographs for marketing purposes using 'consent' as a legal basis.
- 11.4** The School may process different types of information about the Student for the purposes set out above. That information may include:
- Medical records and information, including details of any illnesses, allergies or other medical conditions suffered by the Student.
 - Personal details such as home address, date of birth and next of kin.
 - Passport details of Parents and Students for the processing of visa and ID information.
 - Information concerning the Student's performance at the Summer School, including discipline record and school reports.
 - Financial information including information about the payment of fees paid to the School and the Parents' personal data for debt collection purposes.
 - Photographic and video images of the Student for School publications, on the School website and (where appropriate) on the School's social media channels in accordance with the School's policy on taking, storing and using images of children.
- 11.5** Where, in the professional opinion of the Director of the Summer School it is deemed necessary, we may share information with certain third parties. Examples may include: Agents/travel agencies to secure the booking and to process relevant medical or financial information, transport providers, or partners for pertinent purposes involving academies and third party providers.
- 11.6** Further information on how the School uses personal data can be found in the Privacy Notice on the School website. If you have any queries on how the School uses data or would like to make a Data Subject Access Request, please contact the School's Data Compliance Manager at gdpr@bedes.org

12 GOVERNING LAW

- 12.1 Governing law:** These Terms and Conditions form the basis of any contract between the School and the Parents/Guardian or Agent. The contract is provided in English, and is subject exclusively to the laws and courts of England and Wales.
